| MA/ MS Requirements       | Admission to the MA Program requires a BA or BS which includes a minimum of 15 semester hours in anthropology, including a course in history and theory, archaeology, biological anthropology, cultural anthropology, and statistics. A GPA of 3.250 or better within the last 60 credit hours is also required for full admission. The MA Program offers three track options: (1) Thesis ; (2) Project; (3) Internship. Track 1 requires a comprehensive exam. All tracks require 36 credits, an oral defense, and a written final thesis/project. Up to 12 credits from related disciplines may be counted toward the degree with written approval of the student's MA committee. Graduate coursework must include 3 core courses, 2 seminars, and 2 colloquia in anthropology.   |
