Research Facilities	Collections: Approximately 28,000 catalogued specimens including Eastern North American archaeological items; world-wide ethnographic collections, notably Afghanistan, South American, and African items; late nineteenth century DeForest folk pottery collection, and an extensive early hominid fossil cast collection. The museum houses extensive archaeological collections from Mesoamerica for research and exhibition.
Support Opportunities	The museum offers credit during the academic year for undergraduates. The Ceramic Studies Award provides funds to students for the study of accessioned ceramics. Work-study positions are also available depending on museum operations. The Matson-Benson Award recognizes outstanding contributions to the museum by University graduate students.
