General Description / Special Programs	Roanoke College offers a six-course concentration in Anthropology, open to all majors. Strengths include applied anthropology, medical anthropology, historical anthropology, the anthropology of food and nutrition, Egyptology and archaeology. The concentration offers students the opportunity to study human beings around the globe using a comparative and holistic framework. In this interdisciplinary concentration, students develop a recognition of global and historical cultural diversity that will be beneficial in careers that value cross-cultural communication, including business, the arts, education, public policy, and social services. Students in the anthropology concentration systematically explore the extraordinary range of similarities and differences in humans and human behavior across time and space. Experiential learning is required via a fieldwork course. Opportunities for off-campus community development, archaeology, and global health research opportunities are key features of the program.
