General Description / Special Programs	The department offers more than 140 courses per year. One semester at a Big Ten University may be arranged under CIC Traveling Scholar Program. There are summer archaeological field schools in southern Indiana, Wyoming, Mexico and at other locations. Since 1986, the Skomp Distinguished Lecture Series brings eminent scholars to campus to lecture and interact with students. Summer field research feasibility grants of up to \$3000 for preparation of PhD research proposals are available. The department offers specialization in socio-cultural anthropology, linguistic anthropology, biological anthropology, and archaeology. Special programs include concentrations in medical anthropology, paleoanthropology, archaeology in social context, and anthropology of food. Students can also develop curriculum with concentrations on topics such as culture, media and performance, environmental and economic anthropology, American Indian studies, anthropology of the arts, paleopathology, North American archaeology, several ethnographic areas, among other topics and obtain certificates in global human diversity and ethnography of communication. IU Bloomington offers regular courses in more than 70 languages.
