General Description / Special Programs	<p>The Department of Anthropology is a unit in the Division of Anthropology and Archaeology, which also includes the Archaeology Institute, Florida Public Archaeology Network, and the Maritime Services Center. The graduate program includes Masters degree specializations in both Anthropology and Historical Archaeology. Anthropology includes 5 common core courses in 3 fields of Anthropology, one additional elective course in each of the three supported subfields, and 3 additional unspecified electives, with thesis or internship option. Up to six semester hours can be taken outside Anthropology. The Historical Archaeology track includes 5 common core courses, 3 electives in History, and 3 unspecified electives, with thesis or internship option. Archaeology includes terrestrial and maritime archaeology, and prepares graduates for CRM and public outreach employment and PhD programs. Regular summer field schools offered in maritime and terrestrial archaeology with graduate supervisory training. Public involvement is important component of the archaeology program. Internships with agencies and firms are available. Ethnographic experiences and applied cultural anthropology are regular parts of the program. Bioanthropology focuses on forensics and bioarchaeology.</p>
