Research Facilities	<p>Collections: Anthropological collections cover North America and include approximately 350,000 objects. Archaeological collections are particularly strong for Mississippian North America and Pre-Columbian Mexico. Ethnographic collections focus on Mexican folk and indigenous art and Plains, Woodland, and Oklahoma Indian material culture. Archival collections contain a vast array of documents relating to American and US history and American Indian tribal history and ethnohistory. Noteworthy are imprints and manuscripts in Native American languages. Art collections feature Native, Anglo and Hispanic artists whose focuses on the Americas, particularly the West. Facilities for Visiting Scholars: Work space in the study collections, copiers, computerized specimen catalog, microreader, departmental space and facilities for specimen photography.</p>
