Certificate Info	The Department of Anthropology offers the Certificate in Historical Archaeology and Cultural Resource Management for students wishing to supplement their degree work in other historically oriented programs. The certificate is oriented toward professional practice and provides archaeologically based cultural resource management skills for preservation-related employment. The certificate requires 18 semester hours (two required core seminars and four approved elective courses). Twelve semester hours must come from courses in the Department of Anthropology. The program of study should include a mix of courses in method and theory of historical archaeology and cultural resource management and their practical application. Internship Info	<p>&lt;p&gt;This is a supervised internship or experiential learning experience relevant to anthropology.&amp;nbsp;Internships enable&amp;nbsp;anthropology students, who often engage in anthropological pursuits outside of the classroom in the form of volunteer work ethnographic, laboratory, excavation, forensic, and field experiences, to formalize these out-of-classroom experiences into transferrable experiential learning hours and earn credit toward their undergraduate degree. Internships&amp;nbsp;help students gain anthropological work experience outside of the classroom and assist them with learning new skills which can include but is not limited to excavation, artifact analysis and curation, data gathering including audio-visual and other ethnographic approaches, community engagement/leadership, and forensic analysis.&lt;/p&gt;</p>
