For courses: Housing, transportation to and from the airport and course activities, breakfast every day and sometimes other meals depending on daily course location. One official transcript from Sacred Heart Junior College. Airfare and insurance is not covered. For internships: Housing with a Belizean family, transportation to and from the airport, three meals a day. A telephone and internet access is provided. Airfare and insurance is not covered.
