General Description / Special Programs	<p>The Max Planck Institute for Social Anthropology is one of the world's leading centres for research in socio-cultural anthropology. It was established in 1999 by Chris Hann and Günther Schlee, and moved to its permanent buildings on Advokatenweg 36 in Halle/Saale in 2001. Marie-Claire Foblets joined the Institute as its third Director in 2012. Talented junior scientists are offered the opportunity to earn a doctorate under excellent research conditions. A shared feature of the graduate programmes is the close collaboration with universities. In general, about half of the junior researchers who receive their training at an IMPRS are from Germany and the other half from around the world. The principal component of the 3-year study programme is the doctoral thesis representing a major piece of independent research, mainly in an interdisciplinary topic. The doctoral students also benefit from regular workshops, which facilitate the exchange of information and provide students with the opportunity to see their research topic from different perspectives.</p>
