BA/ BS Requirements	A major in anthropology provides training in several areas: an overview of anthropological inquiry, an awareness of the wide variety of human cultures, intensive investigation of selected conceptual topics, research skills, and the application of anthropology outside the university setting. Requirements for a major include a minimum grade of C in 34 credit hours of anthropology courses. A student's particular program is selected in consultation with a faculty advisor from among the following: 12 credit hours in core courses, 18 credit hours in advanced courses, 4 credit hours in capstone courses.
