In collaboration with the Departments of Geology, Biology and Anthropology, a concentration in Geoarchaeology is offered together with coursework and laboratory training in Geographic Information Systems.

The Rhys Carpenter Library's limited-circulation collection brings together materials supporting the College's programs in History of Art and Architecture, Classical and Near Eastern Archaeology, Greek, Latin, and Classical Studies, and Growth and Structure of Cities.

Internship Info	The department is awarded annually two internships by the Nicholas P. Goulandris Foundation for students to work for a month in the Museum of Cycladic Art in Athens, Greece, with an additional two weeks at an archaeological field project. This is an all-expense paid internship for which students may submit an application. Opportunities to work with the College's archaeology collections are available throughout the academic year and during the summer. The department has two funds that support students for internships and special projects of their own design. One, the Elisabeth Packard Fund for internships in Art History and Archaeology is shared with the Department of the History of Art, while the other is the Anna Lerah Keys Memorial Prize.
