We offer minors in Anthropology, Sociology, and Human Services. Lycoming College has a strong interdisciplinary Archaeology Program in addition to the programs available in the Sociology/Anthropology Department, with a considerable number of double-majors in Archaeology and Anthropology. We offer three cultural area concentrations for our Archaeology majors: Ancient Near East, Classical Mediterranean, and Latin America, along with a minor in Archaeology.
