General Description / Special Programs	<p>The UNT Anthropology BA program is uniquely positioned to address the globalization of Texas, and specifically, the Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex economy and social structure. In the last few years, faculty with expertise on Mexico, Latin America, Pacific, Africa, Europe, India, U.S., linguistics, product and technology use, migration, political economy, ethnicity and identity, environmental and ecological anthropology, and international health have been added, strengthening our established expertise in corporate structure, applied anthropology, culture change, public health and diversity. Minor in Anthropology - Requires completion of 18 hours in anthropology, including ANTH 1010, one introductory (2000-level) course, and 6 hours from the upper-division level (3000 or 4000). Minor in Ethnic Studies - Requires completion of 18 hours (6 must be advanced), including 6 hours from a list of core courses: ANTH 2300 Culture and Society; ANTH 4550 Race, Ethnicity, Identity; SOCI 4540 Race and Ethnic Minorities; or SOWK 4540 Race and Ethnic Minorities. The remaining 12 hours are selected from a list of approved electives. Minor in Medical Anthropology - Requires completion of 18 hours including ANTH 1010 Introduction to Anthropology; 2300 Culture and Society; or 2700 Into to Physical Anthropology; one upper level course: ANTH 4200 Medical Anthropology; or ANTH 4701 Holistic Health. The remaining 9 hours are selected from a list of approved electives. Minor in Applied Anthropology - Requires completion of 12 hours including 2300 Culture and Society; 4000 Applied Anthropology; and 2 courses from 4400 Environmental Anthropology, 4300 Migrants and Refugees, 4701.007 Anthropology of Business, 4601 Anthropology of Education, 4220 Anthropology of Public Health. The goal of the MA/MS in Applied Anthropology is to provide the knowledge necessary for graduates to undertake informed and thoughtful action as street-level practitioners, administrators, agency-based researchers, and program evaluators. Dual Degree-Anthropology/Master of Public Health - Requires completion of 18 hours in MPH core curriculum courses, 15 hours in required courses, and 9 hours in elective courses.</p>

BA/ BS Requirements	Students must meet general requirements for the BA degree in the University Core Curriculum. Majors must complete 36 hrs in anthropology to include 15 hrs required (2300, 2700, 3000 level "area studies", 3650 and 4021); 18 hours of electives, 15 of which must be taken from the upper division level (3000/4000); and Philosophy/Geography/History (3 hrs).

MA/ MS Requirements	The Master's of Arts or Science in Applied Anthropology requires satisfactory completion of a minimum of 36 hours of study and research beyond the bachelor's degree. All master's candidates in applied anthropology are required to take 15 core semester credit hours (5010, 5021, 5031, 5041 and 5050); 15 elective hours, 6 of which must be from outside anthropology; and 6 hours of supervised applied thesis hours (5950). The MPH Dual Degree requires a completion of a total of 45 semester credit hours.
